

Super Ball versus Covid-19: Guidelines and protocols



It has been over a year since the world stopped spinning due to the outbreak of a deadly **Covid-19** pandemic. In order to tackle this situation, we would like to offer you a quick summary of the restrictions imposed by the Czech government, as well as some tips on how to best prepare for the event - and keep yourself and the others protected, of course!

Rules and regulations have changed repeatedly over the last months, so it would be very difficult to list them all and keep the document updated: we will, therefore, summarise the key topics you need to know - in an understandable language.

Overview

In general, life in the Czech Republic in general, and in Prague in particular, is getting back to normal. Restrictions are getting eased and people are starting to go out again. We hope that the mentioned restrictions will be almost completely lifted by mid-August, so all Super Ball attendees will be able to enjoy Prague to the fullest.

You must respect all Covid rules at all times, needless to say, but it's also important to note that police will not fine you right away if you're not wearing a mask or can't find your ID immediately; they will just tell you what you should do. They are sensible people here. Just make sure to do as they say!

If you are vaccinated or have already had Covid in the last 180 days, then you don't have to worry about anything: you will still be asked to follow the restrictions, of course, but at least you are safe.

Traveling

As far as we know, Prague is open for tourists. If you travel by plane, you need to present either a negative PCR test, not older than 72 hours before departure from your country, or a European Covid passport. Importantly, there are not as many inbound flights as they used to, so you better book your trip in advance.



If you arrive by train or bus from abroad, then you will need to have the test or the Covid passport as well. It's not very likely that you will be asked for it, but make sure you have it to be on the safe side.

If you come by car, you will find that the borders are normally accessible. Like with trains and buses, it's unlikely that anyone will stop you and ask for your documentation, but please have your PCR results or your Covid passport ready in any case.

Way back

To go back to your country from the Czech Republic, you will need a negative PCR test too. There are many places where you can have it done: Karlovo namesti, Karlovy lazne club, Poliklinika Vysocany near the Clarion Congress hotel, etc. If you need to get tested to travel back, please ask one of our crew members to help you allocate the place and book a test.

Transportation

To travel by public transportation or use a taxi/Uber, you must wear a mask all the time. It is not compulsory to wear a mask outdoors if you're alone; if you're going with one or more friends/colleagues, however, the law states that you must wear it unless you live in the same social bubble (i.e. you're going with your brother or sister).

Eating out and shopping

It's likely that by mid-August most restaurants and stores will be fully open again. You'll need to wear a mask at all times when entering an indoors space such as these ones; in cafes, bars and restaurants, you can only take it off when you sit down to eat or drink.

Quick note here: one of the best restaurants in Prague, owned by a friend of ours, is ready to welcome you anytime you feel like it. It's called Vallmo Restaurant and it's located in Plavecka 4 street. Don't hesitate to ask us for more information!

Venue and hotel

The Super Ball organisation team will work hard to keep the place clean and follow all Covid restrictions. We will hence provide disinfectants, extra masks and even rubber gloves for whoever requests them.

We want to make clear that we are not going to force people to wear masks inside or outside the venue or hotel: it is everyone's decision whether they want to enter or not. However, we do strongly recommend everyone to wear masks in indoor spaces all the time.



The wellness and fitness centre at the Clarion Hotel should be open by mid-August, and we believe it will stay that way during Super Ball. Only thing we are afraid of, however, is that it might be necessary to book a slot with some time in advance to use the premises. Ask our team for more information.

After party

Clubs and late night bars are a delicate topic: the current situation is not great, although it might evolve positively in the coming weeks. If restrictions are eased, we will organise our official afterparty at the Radlicka Kulturni Sportovna venue; if clubs are still closed by mid-August, the official afterparty will take place in the same Clarion Hotel. The Czech Red Bull team is ready to set up an awesome party to celebrate the end of Super Ball 2021 properly.
